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# 1. Qualitative Information on Consolidated Operating Results, etc. for the Third Quarter Ended July 31, 2010

## (1) Qualitative Information on Consolidated Operating Results

During the first three quarters of the fiscal year under review, despite a gradual recovery in the corporate sector aided by an increase in capital spending, the U.S. economy continued to struggle, particularly with a weak employment environment. In Europe, although exports remained strong, domestic demand was sluggish. Meanwhile, the Asian economy generally remained buoyant, particularly in China, although certain areas started to feel the slowing economy. The Japanese economy continued to grapple with weak domestic demand, a reflection of the severe state of the employment environment, offsetting a gradual turnaround in exports.

In the optical equipment market, demand for single-lens reflex digital cameras and interchangeable lenses remained strong, and compact digital cameras also enjoyed a recovery, especially in Asia and emerging markets. In the electronics equipment market, demand for hard disk drives grew, with notebook computers particularly robust. In the semiconductor exposure device market, sales of glass materials—and especially exposure devices for electronic components—recovered. In the liquid crystal exposure devices market, demand for glass materials also rose, as capital expenditure by liquid crystal panel manufacturers began to improve.

In this environment, net sales in the first three quarters under review stood at ¥20,393 million, up 53.8% year on year, thanks to solid demand for optical glass for single-lens reflex cameras and interchangeable lenses, and stronger needs for hard disk substrates.

The gross margin on sales rose 8.7 percentage points year on year, to 32.1%, reflecting a sharp improvement in the capacity utilization ratio and the results of company-wide initiatives to cut costs and streamline indirect operations. Gross profit was ¥6,548 million, up 110.9% year on year. Although certain expenses declined, mainly as a result of activities to improve the efficiency of indirect operations, freight costs and other expenses increased with the rise in sales. Consequently, selling, general and administrative expenses were ¥3,980 million (rising 4.3% year on year), and operating income was ¥2,567 million (compared with an operating loss of ¥712 million for the same period of the previous fiscal year). Ordinary income came to ¥2,634 million (compared with an ordinary loss of ¥818 million for the same period a year ago) partly because of a decline in foreign exchange losses. As a result of the posting of a loss on valuation of investment securities as an extraordinary item, net income amounted to ¥1,758 million (compared with a net loss of ¥1,171 million for the same period a year earlier).

Results by business segment are as follows:

### (i) Optical business

Looking at optical pressings, the core products in this segment, demand for lens blanks for digital single-lens reflex cameras and interchangeable lenses held firm. Demand for lens blanks for compact digital cameras increased, as did needs for optical blocks.

As a consequence, sales for the segment came to ¥12,144 million (up 33.3% year on year), and operating income was ¥1,532 million (increasing 639.3%).

### (ii) Electronics business

Disk products, the core products in this segment, benefited from a substantial rise in demand for hard disk drive substrates for notebook computers. Demand for quartz glass for projector substrates also increased, as did needs for ultra low expansion glass-ceramics, especially for special purpose products. Demand for highly homogeneous glass materials for semiconductor exposure devices recovered, mainly for semiconductor exposure devices for electronic components.

As a result, sales in the segment were ¥8,249 million (rising 98.7%). Operating income stood at ¥1,035 million (compared with an operating loss of ¥919 million in the same period last year).

The following is a breakdown of results by geographical segment.

(i) Japan

Demand for optical pressings for digital cameras mainly for single-lens reflex cameras and interchangeable lenses remained solid in the optical business, while demand for hard-disk substrates climbed sharply in the electronics business. Demand for ultra low expansion glass-ceramics and quartz glass also rose.

As a consequence, sales were ¥13,257 million (up 72.1% year on year), and operating income was ¥1,538 million (compared with an operating loss of ¥1,949 million in the same period last year).

(ii) Asia

Sales were ¥5,715 million (up 40.9% year on year), and operating income stood at ¥1,080 million (rising 238.5%), reflecting increases in demand for optical pressings for digital cameras, mainly for interchangeable lenses, in the optical business.

(iii) North America

Although demand for optical pressings and blocks in the optical business fell, demand for special products and for highly homogeneous glass materials for semiconductor exposure devices rose in the electronics business. As a result, sales amounted to ¥742 million (rising 4.9% year on year), and operating income was ¥70 million (down 19.8%).

(iv) Europe

Although demand for ultra low expansion glass-ceramics in the electronics business recovered, that for optical pressings in the optical business declined. Consequently, sales were ¥678 million (decreasing 14.7% year on year), and operating income stood at ¥100 million (declining 35.4%).

## (2) Qualitative Information on Consolidated Financial Position

### (i) Financial position

Total assets at the end of the third quarter amounted to ¥56,025 million (up 7.0% from the end of the previous fiscal year), primarily reflecting a rise in notes and accounts receivable-trade of ¥1,847 million and an increase in cash and deposits of ¥523 million.

Total liabilities stood at ¥15,042 million (rising 14.7%), mainly attributable to a rise in notes and accounts payable-trade of ¥1,898 million, an increase in long-term loans payable of ¥1,410 million and, a climb in income taxes payable of 492 million, which offset a decrease in short-term loans payable of ¥1,811 million. Net assets were ¥40,982 million (increasing 4.4%), principally because of net income of ¥1,758 million and a rise in the valuation difference on available-for-sale securities of ¥169 million based on estimates of actual values, and fluctuations in foreign currency translation adjustments of ¥150 million, which offset payments of dividends of ¥364 million.

### (ii) Consolidated cash flows

Cash and cash equivalents (hereinafter "cash") at the end of the third quarter under review stood at ¥9,090 million, rising ¥518 million from the end of the previous fiscal year. A cash outflow, including an increase in notes and accounts receivable-trade, was more than offset by factors including income before income taxes and minority interests, an increase in notes and accounts payable-trade, and depreciation and other amortization.

The following is a description of each category of cash flows and their factors:

#### (Cash flows from operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities was ¥3,088 million (a cash inflow of ¥3,135 million in the same period a year earlier).

The major factors behind the cash inflow included income before income taxes and minority interests of ¥2,367 million, an increase in notes and accounts payable-trade of ¥1,987 million, and depreciation and other amortization of ¥1,577 million, despite a cash outflow including an increase in notes and accounts receivable-trade of ¥1,817 million.

#### (Cash flows from investing activities)

Net cash used in investing activities was ¥1,720 million (a cash outflow of ¥979 million in the same period a year earlier). The cash outflow resulted primarily from payments of ¥1,548 million for the purchase of property, plant and equipment, and payments for investments in capital of ¥101 million.

#### (Cash flows from financial activities)

Net cash used in financial activities was ¥799 million (a cash inflow of ¥499 million in the same period a year earlier).

The cash outflow primarily reflected a decrease in long-term and short-term loans of ¥401 million and cash dividends paid of ¥364 million.
